Community Passports Available for Checkout to Davidson County Residents Now

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – With February and Black History Month underway, now is the perfect time to learn more about Black heritage and culture. In Music City, the National Museum of African American Music is the perfect starting point.

And now, Davidson County residents can access one of our city's best cultural attractions at absolutely no charge. Through a partnership between Nashville Public Library and NMAAM, the library is now offering community passports that provide free entry for up to two visitors to the museum.

"We're thrilled by this partnership, and more importantly, for the opportunity it offers to Davidson County residents," said Linda Harrison, assistant director for education and literacy at NPL. "Nashville is perhaps best known for music, and Black artists played a key role in forming and evolving music that millions of people all over the world know and love. NMAAM is a wonderful place to experience this history, and we're proud to play a role in helping people discover it firsthand."

To qualify for the passports, customers must have an NPL card and be a resident of Davidson County. Passports can be checked out for up to seven days, with no renewals available. Once the passports are used, customers can check them out again at their leisure. The passports can be used during NMAAM's normal business hours.
