MORE THAN 1,200 FREE AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM SLOTS AVAILABLE TO NASHVILLE FAMILIES THROUGH NAZA

Registration Open Now for September 6 Start Date

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Nashville parents and their children now have access to more than 1,200 free, quality afterschool program openings thanks to the Library's Nashville After 7 one Alliance.

Registration is open now for students in grades 5 – 8 to participate in academic and social-emotional enrichment programs at 52 community sites across Nashville.

Nashville Public Library funds and supports these programs through its Nashville After Zone Alliance. In all, NAZA's investment in afterschool and summer programs — including free meals and transportation — totals nearly \$4 million this fiscal year.

"Nashville's children and their families need equitable access to transformative afterschool experiences that can help our city's young people thrive," said NPL's interim director, Terri Luke. "We're honored to play a role in creating those opportunities."

Why Quality Afterschool Time Matters

A student spends only 20% of their waking hours in a traditional classroom, <u>according</u> to the Afterschool Alliance.

<u>The Alliance also reports</u> that quality afterschool time in a safe and supportive environment offers students experiences in STEAM, leadership, career exploration and more. These programs are also an opportunity for students to develop social skills and build confidence.

Program providers at these 52 sites will provide free meals, and most will also offer free transportation between school and afterschool locations.

A NAZA partnership with Metro Nashville Public Schools and other organizations to increase free transportation has removed even more barriers to afterschool opportunities.
