Library Board Receives Restoration Report

As Process at Main Library Continues, So Do Hundreds of Free NPL Programs Across Davidson County

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Disaster response experts today reported to the Nashville Public Library (NPL) Board of Directors about the ongoing restoration process at the Main Library in downtown Nashville following a June 10 fire in the adjacent parking garage.

While the process continues, NPL is offering <u>hundreds</u> of free programs for all ages, access to free public computers and WiFi and free, helpful services through <u>NPL's Book-A-Librarian</u> at branch locations <u>across</u> <u>Davidson County</u>.

The multi-faceted team hired by NPL includes restoration professionals, indoor environmental consultants and industrial hygienists whose assessment of the Main Library—which spans five levels and approximately 300,000 square feet—shows:

Building Assessment

- More than 90 percent of the building sustained very light soot and smoke impact, which occurs when residue found on a surface is so minimal that it cannot at first glance be differentiated from normal dust typically found in any building or workplace
- Less than 10 percent of the building—primarily the Conference Center, Auditorium, Art Gallery, Circulation Workroom, and

connecting hallways on the first floor—sustained **moderate or heavy** impacts

• Moderate impact occurs when a surface is still visible through soot, and heavy impact occurs when a surface cannot be seen through soot

Books and Materials

- Ninety-nine percent of books and materials housed at the Main Library are fully restorable with light cleaning
- Books in Archives and Special Collections did not sustain any damage
- Restoration experts are **evaluating artwork and other assets** within the heavily impacted area of the building

<u>Air Quality</u>

- **Air quality** within the Main Library has been **restored to normal** and will continue to be monitored throughout the restoration process
- Prior to reopening, cleaning and restoration experts will conduct a **final post-cleaning and remediation verification assessment**, including **comprehensive air sampling**
- Additionally, a **separate team of consultants** hired by Metro's insurance carrier are engaged in the process to **review the recommendations and findings** of the experts hired by NPL

Next Steps

- The restoration team working with NPL is targeting **a July 29** reopening date
- Reopening will likely include the entire building except for the Auditorium and Conference Center areas, which will be **blocked off** for longer-term restoration
- NPL will share updates if changes occur that affect the planned reopening date, as can happen during a restoration process of this scale
